ONE BIG STORY Timeline

1875 B.C.	1525 B.C.	1485 B.C.	1445 B.C.	1405 B.C.
Egypt	Moses	Midian	Exodus	Canaan

Biblical Notes:

Pentateuch (“five” “law”) = First Five Books of the Bible, all written by Moses

Kadesh-Barnea: oasis just south of the Land of Canaan

The Plains of Moab: just east of the land of Canaan, across the Jordan River

Judah (Caleb’s tribe) and Ephraim (Joshua’s tribe) become most significant tribes.

“the land flowing with milk and honey” is used 15 times in the Pentateuch.

Complainings/Contentions in the Wilderness:

Fear of death at the Red Sea (Exodus 14:10-12)

Bitter water at Marah (Exodus 15:22-26)

Hunger (Exodus 16:1-3)

Thirst at Horeb (Exodus 17:1-7)

Hardship (Numbers 11:1-3)

Tired of Manna (Numbers 11:4-32)

Rebellion against Moses by Aaron and Miriam (Numbers 12:1-3)

Rebellion against Moses and Aaron (Numbers 14:1-10)

Rebellion against Moses by Korah (Numbers 16:1-40)

Rebellion against Moses and Aaron by the people (Numbers 16:41-50)

Thirst at Meribah (Numbers 20:2-13)

Discouragement (Numbers 21:4-9)

Theological Takeaways:

1. Pivotal moments in life have significant consequences, both positive and negative.
2. Being faithful in small things leads to being faithful in big things.
