Biblical Outline

Ruth 1

- Naomi is widowed and lives in a foreign land away from all her family and people.
- Ruth remains with Naomi, even though she is a Moabite daughter-in-law.
- Naomi and Ruth return to Israel to find food and refuge.

Ruth 2

- Ruth meets Boaz while working in the fields for her mother-in-law.
- Boaz notices her and is kind and gracious to Ruth the foreigner.
- Boaz is a kinsman redeemer for Naomi's husbands family (Elimelech).

Ruth 3

- Naomi and Ruth strategize in order to draw near to Boaz.
- Ruth situates herself near Boaz in order to ask him to be her redeemer.
- Boaz sees her worthiness and agrees to redeem Ruth if no one else will.

Ruth 4

- Boaz redeems Ruth officially in front of the elders.
- God blesses Boaz and Ruth with a son, Obed.
- Obed fathered Jesse and Jesse fathered future King David.

<u>Theological Takeaways</u>

- Boaz redeeming Ruth is a picture of how God is redeeming us.
- God has not forgotten us, even if our circumstances seem to say otherwise.

Application Points

- If God can use Ruth, a Moabite widow, as part of His redemption plan, then he can use anybody. And He will use those who seek refuge under the wing of God like Ruth.
- "God is doing 10,000 things in your life at any time and you might be aware of three of them." John Piper
- Be an expert at seeing the glimpses of God working in and around your life.
