Biblical Outline

Song of Solomon

- Written by Solomon as a young man
- All about love and passion (Viewer discretion advised)
- Very hopeful and optimistic about the future
- Solomon is thinking that pleasure will satisfy him and make him complete.

Proverbs

- Written by Solomon as a middle-aged man to his sons.
- 31 Chapters of pithy statements called "proverbs"
- General statements of truth, not definitive, guaranteed promises
- Seeks to answer the question of "how does the world that God made work?"
- Solomon thinks that wisdom and living right will satisfy him and complete him.
- "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction." Proverbs 1:7

Ecclesiastes

- Written by Solomon as an old man
- Full of major life lessons as told by a man who has had it all and experienced it all
- The tone of this book is much darker and more somber than his previous writings
- Solomon realizes that nothing he chased after in his life ever satisfied him.
- "I have seen everything that is done under the sun, and behold, all is vanity and a striving after the wind." Ecclesiastes 1:14
- "Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man." Ecclesiastes 12:13

Theological Takeaways

- We were created to live in a vibrant, life-giving relationship with God. Sin broke that relationship and we now seek to fill that emptiness with anything but God.
- We are tempted to believe that if I just had ______ then everything would be right and make sense. I would be satisfied and complete if I just had ______.
- Solomon's life shows us that the only thing that will ever satisfy us and complete us is a vibrant, life-giving relationship with God.
