ONE BIG STORY Timeline

931 B.C.	740 B.C.	722 B.C.	586 B.C.	538 B. C.
Divided Kingdom	Isaiah	Fall of Israel (NORTH - Assyrians)	Fall of Judah (SOUTH - Babylonians)	Return to Land

8th Century Prophets: Isaiah, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Jonah and Micah

Themes running throughout Isaiah:

Sin: Yahweh is “the Holy One of Israel” (1:4, 5:19, 24 . . .) God’s people have fallen short of God’s holiness.

Messiah: “There shall come forth a Rod from the stem of Jesse.” (7:14, 9:6-7, 11:1-10, 42:1-4, 49:1-7, 61:1-2) God will send the virgin-born child from the line of David whom God’s Spirit will be on blessing the whole earth.

Salvation: Yahweh is the only Savior. (33:22, 35, 4, 43:3, 43:11, 44:8, 45:5,15,22, 48:17, 49:26, 59:1, 60:16, 63:5,8) God will save by His own arm.

- The three themes converge in Isaiah 53 for God’s ultimate plan for salvation.

Theological Takeaways:

God is a God of holiness and redemption.
Only God can fix the brokenness of our world.
Jesus suffered for our sin as a substitutionary sacrifice.
Jesus’ death is sufficient for all sin, for all people, for all time.
